CODE OF PRACTICE FOR MEMBERS AND SKATERS

Therefore, everyone is encouraged to be open at all times and to share any concerns or complaints that they may have about any aspect of the Club with our Chairman, Mel Webb, or any other member of the Committee.

As a member/participant of Invicta Artistic Roller Skating Club, you are expected to abide by the following code of practice:

- ✓ All members/skaters must respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of age, gender, ability, race, cultural background or religious beliefs or sexual identity.
- ✓ Members/skaters should keep to agreed timings for training and competitions or inform their Coach if they are going to be late.
- ✓ Members/skaters are asked to participate within the group; failure to follow instructions will result in being asked to leave the floor.
- ✓ Members/skaters must wear suitable training kit.
- ✓ Members/skaters must pay any fees for training or events promptly.
- ✓ Members/skaters are not allowed to smoke, consume alcohol or drugs of any kind on the Club premises or whilst representing the Club.
- ✓ Members/skaters should not use social networking sites to express derogatory views about the Club or any of its members.
